Study Time Suggestions for This Series -

PREPARING YOURSELF – Find a quiet place where you can listen to the Lord Jesus without distractions or interruptions. Have your Bible and paper and pen, along with your study guide, ready. You may want to have more than one translation or paraphrase of the Bible for additional insight and clarity. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your thoughts and to make His truth known to you as you read the Word of God.

READING – There will be several Scripture verses for you to ponder as you begin your study. Each of them begin with the words, "Let us . . .". They are the instructions that the writer is giving to the young believers as they seek to learn what it means to follow and obey Jesus. If you can, read each verse several times, using various translations if possible.

REFLECTING - Ask yourself the following questions as you read the context of these verses.

Write down your thoughts, observations, and insights below each of them.

- 1. Why did the writer give these instructions?
- 2. What does He mean by them? Try to put the verses into your own words.
- 3. What will be the result of following these instructions? Are there benefits or rewards?
- 4. Is there any specific motivation that is given to encourage an individual to action?

RESPONDING – What do you think that the Holy Spirit is prompting you to consider personally? There are suggestions in each study guide to assist you. Don't miss out on the blessing and opportunity to not only respond personally, but to receive and give encouragement to others.

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Lesson 1 - Which Way is the Best Way?

Paul wrote to those who belong to Christ Jesus:

"I want you to understand what really matters, so that you may live pure and blameless lives until the day of Christ's return.

May you always be filled with the fruit of your salvation - the righteous character produced in your life by Jesus Christ - for this will bring much glory and praise to God.

Philippians 1: 10 - 11

Before you open up your Bible, spend some minutes in worship and praise.

Can you re-write the opening verse as your own prayer to The One who gave His life so that you could be forgiven and reconciled to God?

REFLECT – As you ponder these passages of Scripture, consider <u>why</u> Paul is giving these specific instructions. How would following these directions to create Jesus' character in your heart and mind and bring glory to the Lord Jesus?

RESPOND -

- 1. As you look back at the "GPS" given in Romans and II Corinthians, how carefully are you are following each of these directions? Is there any place where you might need to change your attitude, behavior or choices in order to avoid some hazardous experiences or useless detours? Would you say you are headed in the right direction? Why or why not? (Be careful that you do not use other people as your measuring stick.)
- 2. As you take time to quietly listen for the voice of the Lord, what do you hear Him saying to you? Focus on just 1 or 2 of these verses and let the Spirit of God direct your thoughts, asking Him to show you the path that would be best for you to take. How could you modify or change your route so that you are going in the best direction?
- 3. Just as it is helpful to have someone else with you to assist you in reading the map, so it is in our spiritual journey. Who can you encourage along the way? Who is a trusted friend that will talk with you about your strengths and your weaknesses and will pray for you? If no one comes to mind, ask God to show you someone and then you'll have to take some risks!

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Lesson 2 - WITH WHOM ARE YOU TRAVELING?

Paul wrote to his brothers in Christ:

"Now may the God of peace make you holy in every way and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless until our Lord Jesus comes again.

God will make this happen, for He who calls you is faithful." I Thessalonians 5: 23

Before you open up your Bible, spend some minutes in worship and praise. What is prayer of your own heart as you read this verse? Talk with the Lord Jesus about your concerns and desires.

RESPOND

- 1. As you look back at the "GPS" given in Galatians and I Thessalonians, how carefully are you are following each of these directions?
 - Which ones might be particularly important for you to consider at this point in your spiritual journey? Have you veered off course in any way?
- 2. As you take time to listen to the still, soft voice of the Lord, what do you hear Him saying to you? What do you think He might be prompting you to consider more intentionally, paying attention to what would please Him and bring glory to His name?
- 3. Who is helping you to stay on the right road, to keep moving on, and to focus on your destination at this time in your life? Who are you encouraging and praying for and with so that they keep going in the best direction? What a blessing it is when God gives us "traveling companions".

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Lesson 3 - Are You Willing to Take a Risk?

I pray that from His glorious, unlimited resources God will empower you with inner strength through His Spirit.

Then Christ will make His home in your hearts as you trust in Him. Your roots will grow down into God's love and keep you strong.

Is this your prayer, too? Take some time to give thanks and to worship the Lord before you express the desires of your heart.

RESPOND

- 1. As you reread each of these instructions written to the author's brothers and sisters in Christ, how do you measure up? Would you say that you are "traveling in the right direction" or do some adjustments or corrections need to be made?
- 2. God's often gently whispers our name and longs to show us new paths which He wants us to be willing to take even when we cannot see around the corner or the light at the end of the tunnel. Are you willing to take His hand and follow Him? He is waiting for you to make the choice.
- 3. As you consider God's leading for you, why not ask a friend to pray with you and for you along this unknown journey. As you share, perhaps you can do the same thing for your friend. When you go together with Jesus as your leader, It's a great way to go.

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Lesson 4 - WHO NEEDS YOUR ENCOURAGEMENT?

By His divine power, God has given us everything we need for living a Godly life. We have received all of this by coming to know Him, the one who called us to Himself by means of His marvelous glory and excellence.

Do you believe this verse? Is it really true for you? Check out the next verse - II Peter 1: 4 - in order to understand it better. How can these truths help you go in the right direction more consistently and joyfully? What is your prayer?

- 2. Are there one or two of these verses that have particularly caused you to pause and to think about your own attitudes and actions? Where do you think God's Spirit would like to enable you to travel more directly or go more intentionally in the days ahead? What promises does He want you to believe so that you will reach your destination unhindered and expectantly?
- 3. Who needs your encouragement? Your kind words? Your smile? Your help? Your mercy? And most of all, your love? How does God want to make His presence known through what you do and what you say? Let's get going while there is time!
